Framework Review

- Where we are
- Specific proposals
- Rocks on the Road

Where we are

- Two Directives, a Regulation and a Recommendation
- Adopted in November 2007
- Recommendation on effect
- Currently in Council and European Parliament
- Progress Report to Ministers on Thursday (Telecoms Council);
- EP Committee (ITRE, IMCO) in July
- First Plenary EP Reading in September
- Common Position in November (French Presidency)
- Second Reading / Final Agreement; March 2009 (Czech Presidency)
- Entry into force; late 2010

Specific Proposals

- Commission proposals limited to Recommendation and information requirements (Article 5, FW)
- Council “recitals” on investment / access
- UK proposed technology neutral approach (fibre / copper / wireless) in Access directive
- ITRE (Trautman and others) proposals (recitals) to limit access regulation in line with investment; favour infrastructure competition;
- Sunset for ex-ante regulation

Rocks on the Road

- Differential access regulation for fibre;
- Damaging trade off investment / access regulation / functional separation
- Regulation affecting / limiting business models
- Sunset for ex-ante regulation

Recommendation on Next Generation Access

- Has been long on expectation
- Expect Commission to publish it before Summer
- Will be considered in Communications Committee (COCOM);
- Advisory procedure
- Expected to focus on economic importance
- And to stress importance of access regulation for different business models of fibre deployment (VDSL; passive, point to point);
